

EXITO is characterized by rapid growth and massive root development. Black oats (Avena strigosa) can contribute up to 1650 kg of effective organic matter per hectare to the soil when used as a cover crop, especially with early sowing.

Black oat (Avena strigosa) is a non-host for Pratylenchus penetrans and Meloidogyne hapla. These nematodes causes problems in crops such as potatoes, carrots, and onions. It is a good host for the multiplication of root-knot nematodes Meloidogyne chitwoodil fallax. Check www.best4soil.eu for a more detailed and complete overview.
